Vaccines are the most effective way to prevent many infectious diseases. help to protect you and your child from many serious and potentially deadly diseases. protect other people in your family and community – by helping to stop diseases spreading to people who cannot have vaccines, such as babies too young to be vaccinated and those who are too ill to be vaccinated.





Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)





The RSV vaccine helps protect against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), a common virus that can make babies and older adults seriously ill.

The RSV vaccine helps reduce the risk of serious breathing problems like pneumonia and bronchiolitis.

Eligibility:

- Pregnant women
- Age: 75 to 79 years
- If you turned 80 after 1
 September 2024, you're
 eligible for the RSV
 vaccine until 31 August
 2025.


HPV VACCINE

The HPV vaccine helps protect against human papillomavirus (HPV). It's recommended for children aged 12 to 13 years old and people at higher risk from HPV.

What to Know About HPV

- There is a vaccine to prevent HPV, there is no cure for the virus.
- High-risk HPV types should be routinely monitored.
- Safer sex helps prevent the spread of HPV.
- Many infections will resolve on their own without treatment.

Where High Risk HPV Can
Cause Cancer



Eligibility:

Children aged 12-13 years of age - will be done at school

If missed at school, a catch up vaccination is offered at the GP surgery for all eligible boys and girls aged 16 - 25 years.



MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine

These 3 infections spread easily between people and can lead to serious problems including meningitis, blindness and hearing loss.

Eligibility:

1 year old

3 years 4 months old
